Many law enforcement agencies and fire departments are reporting an increase in cases involving Meth labs. Seizures of meth labs in Northeast Florida were up 83% in 2011 over 2010. According to the National Drug Intelligence Center Methamphetamine poses a serious and increasing threat to Florida and is a major public health problem in some areas of the state. The drug is frequently available and abused in rural areas and is increasingly available and abused in suburban and metropolitan areas.

Many agencies are reporting a sharp increase in the number of labs in various parts of the State that typically had not seen this type of crime and reports are that the economy is a driving force behind the increase.

These labs are potentially serious health and safety issues for anyone entering the property. This includes first responders and representatives from both the public and private sector.

This training will provide the attendee with information on how to identify a meth lab, the common ingredients and materials used in making meth, safety and health risks, and safety precautions that should be used while investigating losses involving meth labs. We will conclude the training with a presentation on the legal and insurance coverage concerns that should be considered in the handling of claims and investigations involving suspected meth labs.
